Hometown driver Cody Keller of Selinsgrove scored a popular win in the 30-lap Spring Showdown for 360 sprint cars in Saturday night's season opener at Selinsgrove Speedway with the United Racing Club and Empire Super Sprints.

Keller's fourth career sprint car victory at the wheel of the Keller's Auto Body No. 99 was worth \$2,200 and came over a stellar field of 33 360 sprint cars.

Jeff Rine opened his late model title defense with his 97th career win at the track in the 25-lap super late model feature, while Andrew Shoop of Mifflintown scored his second opening day win in a row in the 15-lap pro stock race.

Next Saturday the speedway will be dark to prepare for the first All Star Sprint Car race at the track in 16 years. The All Start Circuit of Champions Sprint Car series will be in action in a 30-lap A-main paying \$5,000 to win for 410 sprint cars at 6 p.m. Sunday, April 24. Track gates will open at 4 p.m.

Front row starters Steve Collins and Cody Keller thrilled the fans trading the race lead on the opening lap of the sprint car feature before a red flag for a wild flip by Jordan Thomas. Thomas was ok and when the race restarted Collins and Keller picked up right where they had left off dueling for the top spot before Keller secured it on lap five.

The race would go through without another stoppage allowing the field to cover the whole speedway with cars. Robbie Stillwagon picked up the runner up spot from Collins as lap nine went onto the scoreboard. While things settled down in the front of the field Mark Smith was working his way from the 15th starting spot into the top five. Although Stillwagon closed in on the leader a few times, Keller began to open up a large lead by halfway at lap 15.

Smith had worked by Justin Barger for third on lap 15 and gave chase of Stillwagon for second. As the race wound down Keller continued to cut through lap traffic and grow his lead over now second spot Mark Smith. Although Smith persisted to charge toward the leader time was up and Cody Keller met the checkered flag for the opening night win which he dedicated to his grandfather who passed away over the offseason. It was Keller's fourth Selinsgrove win.

Smith finished in second with Stillwagon and Barger inside the top five with Jason

Clauss. Davie Franek gained ten spots to finish sixth just ahead of Curt Michael, Derek Locke, Steve Collins, and Ryan Kissinger. Heat races for the Newville Family of Companies 360 Sprints went to Steve Collins, Cody Keller, Justin Hoffman, Robbie Stillwagon with the B-Main victory going to Jordan Thomas.

Jeff Rine used a great start and big move off turn four to power by early race leader Dave Zona while battling with Colby Frye in the Jeff's Auto Body & Recycling Center Super Late Model feature. Once out front Rine drove away from a fierce battle for second between Coleby Frye and Bryan Bernheisel.

Rine was in lap traffic by lap eight while Frye closed the gap for the race lead. A lap 11 restart saw Frye give his best effort for the lead on a restart, but Rine was able to fend him off. The race again heated up for the runner up spot as Steve Campbell challenged Frye and Bernheisel. Once Campbell was able to take second on lap 23 his only hope for a shot at the leader was a yellow. The green flag remained out and Jeff Rine claimed career win number 97 at the speedway in the season opener.

Campbell, Frye, Jim Yoder, and Bernheisel rounded out the top five. Dave Zona was the sixth car across the line with Hayne Mattern, Tony Adams, Larry Baer, and Luke Hoffer rounding out the top ten. Heat race winners went to Bryan Bernheisel, Steve Campbell, and Jeff Rine.

Andrew Shoop had no easy task to win the season opener in the A&A Auto Stores Pro Stock feature event. Shoop, who is coming off a Pro Stock title season, held off numerous attempts from fifth place starter Tommy Slanker and last year's big Pro Stock winner Brad Mitch.

On lap ten the top three closed to run all but nose to tail for the top spot as Shoop maneuvered around some of the lap traffic. Once clear Shoop drove away to the opening night win. The battle for second was settled with a slide job and cross over on the last corner with Slanker taking the spot over Mitch. Kurt Wray and John Troxell rounded out the top five finishers. Matt Hornberger, Nate Stroup, Dan Condo, John Bouse, and Peanut Heintzelman rounded out the top ten. Heat races were won by Brad Mitch, Tommy Slaker, and Kurt Wray.

DANNY DIETRICH MAKES LATE-RACE PASS BY DAVE BLANEY TO WIN ALL STAR RAY TILLEY CLASSIC AT SELINSGROVE SPEEDWAY

SELINSGROVE, Pa. -- Danny Dietrich of Gettysburg used a "never say die" attitude when the Arctic Cat All Star Circuit of Champions Sprint Car Series returned for the first time in 16 years to Selinsgrove Speedway Sunday night.

The \$5,000 victory in the 30-lap Ray Tilley Classic was Dietrich's second of the weekend in central Pennsylvania and second straight in 410 sprint car racing at Selinsgrove after having won last September's National Open.

Dave Blaney and Dietrich raced side by side for the first lap of the dash before Blaney took control and it was for good. Blaney never looked back and led the whole way to gain the pole for the feature event.

At the drop of the green flag for the night's main event Blaney jumped out to the early lead before a red flag flew for Caleb Armstrong and Ryan Kissinger. Armstrong's ride went over, but he was ok. On the ensuing restart, the 1987 National Open winner again took a commanding lead while series point leader Chad Kemenah drove into second. Kemenah would stay there until he brought out the caution on lap four as his car slowed.

Blaney again bolted away from the rest of the field on the restart and pulled away from a great battle for second between Danny Dietrich and Kraig Kinser. Mark Smith soon joined that battle for the runner up spot. Blaney's straightaway lead was erased when

Aaron Ott slowed on lap 12.

On this restart Smith would move around Kinser for third and close in on Dietrich for second. Dale Blaney also began to close in on the battle as he moved by Kinser for fourth. In the mean time Blaney had driven away again to a sizeable advantage.

The whole race changed when the yellow flag was thrown for Lee Jacobs slowing to a stop on the front stretch. Dietrich had a shot at the race lead and he would take advantage of it. Dietrich had a good start and hung right with Blaney on the inside line while Blaney sailed around the outside of the track. Dietrich was finally able to pull even with Blaney on lap 27 and at the line to score lap 28 Dietrich inched ahead. From that point Dietrich was on his way to his second career Selinsgrove win and his sixth win with the All Stars.

Dietrich followed up his first Selinsgrove Speedway win in the finale of 2015 with a win in the first 410 Sprint Car race of the season in 2016.

Blaney came home second with Mark Smith rounding out the top three. The previous night winner Dale Blaney came home fourth with Blane Heimbach coming home in fifth.

Kraig Kinser, Brent Marks, Lucas Wolfe, Sheldon Haudenschild, and Pat Cannon rounded out the top ten finishers. Haudenschild was the hard charger for the night after grabbing the final transfer spot in the B-Main.

Heat races for the 410 Sprint Cars were won by Mark Smith, Greg Hodnett, Dave Blaney, and Blane Heimbach . TJ Stutts took the B-Main.

The Saturday night race was run in honor of Ray Tilley who is the all time 410 Sprint Car feature winner at Selinsgrove Speedway.

The Fast Tees Fast Timer in memory of Jim Nace was Dietrich.

The remaining 410 Sprint Car races will be held on Friday, June 10 and Sunday, July 3 in the Speedweek finale in memory of Jan Opperman and Dick Boger. Then two Saturday night races on August 13 and September 17 with the Jim Nace Memorial National Open.

SMITH WINS RAIN-SHORTENED SPRINT CAR GUNN MEMORIAL; MITCH POWERS TO FIRST PRO STOCK VICTORY OF SEASON; LATE MODEL MAKEUP FEATURE ADDED TO MAY 7 "PACK THE TRACK"

SELINSGROVE, Pa. - On the night of the 36th annual Jack Gunn Memorial there were two races going on at Selinsgrove Speedway. One race was on the track and the other was against mother nature and an impending storm Saturday evening.

Although the racing was fast paced all night and moved along quickly, mother nature still got the best of the 30-lap Gunn Memorial. The race was past halfway and considered complete on lap 18 with Mark Smith of Sunbury declared the winner for the second year in a row in the \$2,200-to-win event. Brad Mitch of McClure also grabbed a Pro Stock win in the division's 15-lap main before the rains came.

Robbie Stillwagon of Burlington, N.J., started the night off with the Fast Tees Fast Time Award (17.499) over the 28-car field for the Newville Family of Companies 360 Sprint Cars which were joined by the United Racing Club.

Rains hit before the Jeff's Auto Body & Recycling Center Super Late Model feature was held. The makeup feature will be run during the May 7 "Pack the Track" night. Chad Hollenbeck, Tony Adams, and Coleby Frye won the heat races for the stout 27-car Late Model field.

The Roadrunner feature was also postponed to a later date to be announced.

This coming Saturday, May 7, will be the annual PEPSI "Pack the Track" night featuring \$5 General Admission for all adults and students. Kids 11 years of age and younger will be admitted FREE. The May 7 racing card will include a full program of 360 Sprint Cars, Pro Stocks, Roadrunners and two late model features. Gates will open at 5 p.m. with racing at 7 p.m.

Once heat races and a B-main were completed the Sprint Car feature line up was set with Mark Smith bringing the field to the green flag as the defending winner of the race. A strong start for fourth-place starter Josh Weller shot him into the race lead. A lap six caution flag gave Smith a chance to regroup and take a shot to regain the top spot. By the time the field returned to the flag stand for lap seven Smith was again showing the way while being chased by Weller.

On lap 12 Smith began to work into lapped traffic and that allowed Weller to begin to close up the gap along with TJ Stutts. Stutts was all over Weller when the yellow flag flew again on lap 17 for Curt Michael slowing with a flat tire. The yellow was good for Smith again giving him the open track.

Stutts was on Weller when the green flew again allowing Smith to get away a little bit before the yellow was displayed for the final time. Jim Shuster was slowing on the

backstretch as the rain began to fall on the speedway. Drivers gave officials the sign that the racing surface was not what it needed to be for them to compete any further and they were sent to the pits and the race was called official soon after.

The win is Smith's 16th career victory at the speedway in 358-360 Sprint Car racing and his seventh in a URC sanctioned event at the track dating back to 2012. Weller came home in second followed by Stutts, Ryan Kissinger from the 13th starting spot, and Robbie Stillwagon. Jason Shultz, Cody Keller, Nate Snyder, Ed Aiken, and John Braim were the top ten in the rain-shortened event.

Joe Trenca, Josh Weller, Tj Stutts won the heat races with Colby Womer winning the B main.

Brad Mitch was on a mission to grab his 20th career Selinsgrove Speedway victory and he did just that in the A&A Auto Stores Pro Stock feature event. Mitch led early over opening night winner Andrew Shoop before Shoop went pitside with an issue. Kurt Wray became the runner up and put a ton of pressure on Mitch before he too had an issue that sidelined his car.

Brandon Moser kept Mitch honest the rest of the race by staying on his rear bumper, but was not able to complete the pass and had to settle for second. Matt Wilson, Curtis Lawton, and Jeff Ceballo rounded out the top five. Mitch and Shoop won heat races for the Pro Stocks.

TOMECEK'S MISFORTUNE HANDS SMITH SPRINT CAR KRAMER CUP; KNAUB & RINE SPLIT WINS IN DUAL LATE MODEL MAIN EVENTS; HOFFMAN RETURNS TO PRO STOCK VICTORY LANE

SELINSGROVE, Pa. -- Selinsgrove Speedway presented the Third Annual Selinsgrove Ford/ United Racing Club Kramer Cup Saturday, May 28, to honor the memory of sprint car racing legend Kramer Williamson of Palmyra, who succumbed to injuries he sustained in a sprint car racing accident at the Lincoln Speedway in Abbottstown in 2013. The tribute race marked the second event of the season at Selinsgrove sanctioned by the United Racing Club 360 sprint cars.

There is an old saying that sometimes it is better to be lucky than good. Saturday night's Newville Family of Companies/United Racing Club 360 Sprint Car Kramer Cup feature played out in a way similar to that saying. It was the misfortune of race-long leader Eric Tomecek, who hit the third turn wall with two to go, that handed the lead to Mark Smith. Smith had just finished a multi-lap side by side battle with TJ Stutts for the runner up spot when Tomecek wrecked.

Smith got a good start over Stutts on lap 28 and left Jason Shultz and Stutts in

battle for second on his way to his second Kramer Cup win and his 17th career Selinsgrove Speedway win. Smith has won eight URC events at the track since 2012. Saturday night's \$2,573 victory was Smith's second of the season at Selinsgrove driving the Mach 1 Chassis No. 1 entry.

Smith, Stutts, Shultz, Josh Weller, and Curt Michael were the top five finishers. URC point leader Davie Franek finished in sixth with Troy Betts seventh. Robbie Stillwaggon, Ed Aikin, and Adam Carberry rounded out the top ten finishers.

Josh Weller, Robbie Stillwagon, TJ Stutts, and Mark Smith won heat races for the 34 360 Sprint Car field with the B-Main being won by Nate Snyder. Selinsgrove Ford sponsored \$73 to win all heat races in memory of Williamson. Jordan Thomas was the IBEW Local Electrical Union 1319 Hard Charger by advancing nine positions in the A-main.

Gene Knaub looked like a lock to win the feature that was being made up from April 30th for the Jeff's Auto Body & Recycling Late Models to kick off the night's racing. Knaub began to have mechanical failure with three laps to go. A two-second lead vanished and Steve Campbell and Coleby Frye were on the leader's tail when the field saw two to go. Knaub withstood the late-race challenges to hang on and win his second career Selinsgrove feature and become the second different winner in the class this season.

Campbell settled for second and held off Frye who finished third. Jeff Rine finished in fourth with Chad Hollenbeck following in fifth. Tony Adams, Jim Yoder, Dave Zona, Matt Cochran, and Austin Berry rounded out the top ten finishers.

Jeff Rine started from the front row of the second Late Model feature of the night looking for his 98th career Selinsgrove Speedway feature win. By lap nine Rine was in lapped traffic while Steve Campbell worked his way to the front. Rine looked to have the field covered when a late race restart gave Campbell a shot at the leader. Campbell was unable to make the move around Rine on the restart and Rine drifted out of Campbell's reach to the win.

Campbell was able to hold off polesitter Chris Casner for second. The second place finish was Campbell's third runner-up finish in the three Late Model races this year at the track. Casner had to settle for third. Tony Adams and Bryan Bernheisel finished out the top five finishers. Jim Yoder came across the line in sixth followed by Chad Hollenback, Shawn Jones, Coleby Frye, and Hayes Mattern. Bryan Bernheisel, Chad Hollenbeck, and Shawn Jones won the heat races with Gene Knaub winning the consolation.

AJ Hoffman led the early stages of the A&A Auto Stores Pro Stock main event while Curtis Lawton hounded him for the race lead. Brandon Moser soon joined the duel at the front for the lead. As Lawton and Moser ran side-by-side Hoffman began to pull away. Opening night winner Andrew Shoop soon joined the race for second. On lap 7, just before halfway, Shoop slid into second. Shoop closed a little bit on Hoffman, but could not reel in the race leader before the 15-lap feature ended.

Hoffman secured his first win at the track since 2012 saying he didn't know if he would ever get back to victory lane. Shoop was second just ahead of Moser, Lawton, and Nate Stroup. John Troxell was sixth followed by Jim Payne, Dan Condo, Tommy Slanker, and Bill Conrad. Hoffman and Moser were heat race winners.

Next Saturday night, June 4, at Selinsgrove Speedway the United Racing Club 360 Sprint Cars will return to compete along with the 305 Sprints in an open wheel doubleheader. The rescheduled A&A Auto Stores Pro Stock 20 will also be on the racing card along with two roadrunner features. Gates will open at 5 pm with racing at 7pm.

SELINSGROVE, Pa. -- Bad luck struck Mark Smith in a big way just past halfway of Saturday night's 25-lap 360 Sprint car feature at Selinsgrove Speedway. It was the fourth time in 2016 that the United Racing Club joined the Newville Family of Companies 360 Sprint cars at the Speedway.

Smith took the race lead on the start of the sprint car feature from the front row and led until lap 16 when his car made contact with a lapped car and then the wall before flipping on the fronstretch into turn one. When Smith's bad luck struck it quickly spread through the top three as second place Curt Michael and third place Jason Shultz were caught up in the accident as well. All drivers walked away from the scary incident unharmed.

Robbie Stillwaggon inherited the race lead sharing the front row for the restart with TJ Stutts. Stillwaggon and Stutts traded the race lead numerous times over the next couple of laps before Stutts took over. Lap 20 marked the second time the field would regroup, this time for a Jim Schuster yellow flag.

Ryan Kissinger was the fastest car on the track before the big wreck and remained the fastest car throughout the next couple of laps. Kissinger then began to reel in Stutts and on lap 22 completed the pass for the top spot from his seventh starting position.

Kissinger led the rest of the way ahead of Stutts and Stillwaggon. It looked like point leader Scott Lutz had everything under control when suddenly Tyler Reeser charged into the top spot. Reeser used the outside line early in the 20-lap event and lost a bunch of ground from his fourth starting spot while Lutz drove to a comfortable advantage.

Reeser quickly adjusted and was able to run down Lutz by lap 14 and make the pass for the race lead by lap 16. Reeser crossed the line in 6:50.613 for a new track record. Zach Newlin snuck by Lutz at the end for second. Lutz, John Martin, and Ken Duke rounded out the top five finishers. Cale Reigle, Kyle Ganoe, Dave Grube, Erin Statler, and Geoff Gill were the top ten finishers in the 305 Sprint Car feature event. Cale Reigle and Tyler Reeser were heat race winners.

The A&A Auto Stores Pro Stocks filled the pit area for their annual Pro Stock 20 Saturday night. The defending winner AJ Stroup has not made a start this year at the speedway but came out in style and showed the way early in the event.

Adam Campbell was begging to mount a charge at the top spot when rain his the speedway. Although Stroup was happy to see the rain on lap 15 that ended up finishing the Pro Stock 20 early, he admitted it would have been a good finish in victory lane. While Stroup and Campbell pulled away the field battled fiercely behind them for every spot. Brad Mitch held on for third with Brandon Moser and Jake Buck rounding out the top five finishers.

Andrew Shoop, AJ Hoffman, John Troxell, Curtis Lawton, and Jim Payne rounded out the top ten finishers in the 2016 Pro Stock 20. With his win, Stroup joins Kyle Bachman, AJ Hoffman, Jason Smith, and Gary Beward as repeat winners of the event. Matt Hornberger, Brandon Moser, and Brad Mitch were the heat race winners for a stellar 24 car field.

The 25-lap main event will pay \$3,500 to win. The pro stocks will join the 410 sprint cars on the first Friday night show at the track in 10 years.

The speedway will swing back into action at 7 p.m. Sunday, June 12, with the Appalachian Mountain Late Model Speedweek Finale plus limited late models. The 40-lap super late model main event will pay \$4,000 to win. Track gates will open at 5 p.m.

HODNETT SHINES IN SELINSGROVE 410 SPRINT CAR FRIDAY NIGHT LIGHTS SPECIAL! RACE PRODUCES FOUR DIFFERENT LEADERS, INTENSE WHEEL-TO-WHEEL RACING! SLANKER SCORED FIRST CAREER PRO STOCK VICTORY!

SELINSGROVE, Pa. – Ten years passed since Selinsgrove Speedway ran a special Friday night 410 sprint car race, and the wait was worth it when the division took the spotlight in the 25-lap "Friday Night Lights" main event with no fewer than four different leaders taking a shot at the \$3,500 win.

At the checkered flag, Greg Hodnett of York held off Brent Marks of Myerstown and Lucas Wolfe of Mechanicsburg by less than a one-second margin separating first from third. The victory was Hodnett's 10th of the season and 17th career at Selinsgrove in 410 racing at the wheel of the Lelands.com No. 27.

Tommy Slanker also held off challenges to score his first career pro stock victory in the division's 15-lap main event.

Selinsgrove Speedway will be in action at 7 p.m. this Sunday, June 12, with the Appalachian Mountain Late Model Speedweek Series Finale plus limited late models. Track gates will open at 5 p.m. There is no racing at the track Saturday, June 11.

Outside front row starter TJ Stutts pulled into the lead at the start of the 410 sprint car feature. On the first two circuits, Stutts and polesitter Brock Zearfoss dueled for the lead. Meanwhile fifth-place starter Brent Marks raced third as sixth-place starter Greg Hodnett advanced to fourth on the third circuit.

Stutts, who won back-to-back Friday night 410 sprint car races in March of 2006, saw his hopes of keeping his Friday night winning streak alive go away on lap six when his car lost power on the frontstretch and coasted into the pit area. Zearfoss took command of the field with Marks applying pressure in traffic.

On the 10th lap, Marks made an exciting dive to the inside of Zearfoss entering turn three for the lead only to have the red flag unfurl when Scott Wilson hit the fourth turn wall and roll over in front of the leaders. Wilson escaped injury.

When the race resumed, a three-car war on wheels unfolded for the lead entering turn one between Zearfoss, Marks, and Hodnett. Marks took the lead on lap 12

with a pass by Zearfoss in turn three. A lap later, Hodnett drove into second.

The final 10 laps produced some of the most intense sprint car racing of the season as ninth-place starter Lucas Wolfe showed some speed and made it a three-car battle to the finish. On the 18th circuit, Hodnett took the lead in turn four when Marks drifted high. However, Marks and now Wolfe closed in on Hodnett in lapped traffic. Both Marks and Wolfe took shots at Hodnett to no avail.

At the checkered flag, Hodnett was victorious by just .47 of a second over Marks with Wolfe crossing the line just .91 of a second behind Hodnett in third. Ryan Smith and Blane Heimbach completed the top five.

Second-place starter Matt Hornberger led the first lap of the pro stock feature after a lap one restart for a three-car tangle in turn two. Fifth-place starter Adam Campbell made a charge into second on the restart and came away with the lead on lap two.

By lap six, eighth-place starter Tommy Slanker made his way to the front of the pack and powered into the runner up spot. With five laps to race, Slanker moved into striking distance of Campbell, who spun a lap later on the backstretch.

Slanker inherited the lead and drove to a mere 1.28 second margin of victory over Kurt Wray, Brad Mitch, Curtis Lawton, and Matt Hornberger.

TOMECEK & SMITH SPLIT 360 SPRINT CAR FEATURE WINS; FRYE TAKES RACE 4 IN MOON SHINE CAMO ROUTE 35 LATE MODEL SERIES; NASCAR VETERAN STREMME DRIVES TO MID-ATLANTIC MODIFIED CHECKERS; WRAY WINS FIRST CAREER PRO STOCK RACE

SELINSGROVE, Pa. – On a hot summer night, nearly 100 race cars packed the pits at Selinsgrove Speedway Saturday with a pair of 360 sprint car features, a Moon Shine Camo Route 35 Late Model Challenge Series race, the Mid-Atlantic modifieds, and pro stocks all on a blockbuster racing program.

Eric Tomacek of Abbottstown and Mark Smith of Sunbury split the victories in the 25-lap sprint car races, while Coleby Frye of Dover won his first race of the year in the 25-lap Moon Shine Camo Route 35 Late Model Challenge Series. NASCAR veteran David Stremme of Davidson, N.C., drove to a victory in the first-ever 20-lap Mid-Atlantic modified series race, with Kurt Wray of Beavertown posting his first career pro stock win in the division's 15-lap feature.

Selinsgrove Speedway will present the 16th Annual Mach 1 Chassis National Open for 360 sprint cars Saturday, July 30, paying \$10,000 to win as part of the inaugural Mid-Atlantic Crown Series "Weekend of Money" that includes the Lelands.com 360 Nationals at Williams Grove Speedway Friday, July 29, and concludes with the Cole Cup at the Utica Rome Speedway in New York Sunday, July 31. The super late models and pro stocks will also be on the July 30 racing card at Selinsgrove Speedway.

Eric Parker took the lead early in the makeup feature for the 360 Sprint Cars. The race was being run from the Jeff's Auto Body & Recycling Center Driver & Fan Appreciation Night July 16th. Michael Walter wrestled the top spot away from Parker on lap six. Eric Tomecek also moved by Parker for the second spot a few laps later. Mark Smith was in a battle for the third spot when his engine left go setting up a lap 17 restart.

Just before the yellow flag Tomecek used the inside line to drive into the top spot. Robbie Stillwaggon took over the second spot in a short run before another yellow flag was needed. STUTTS POWERS TO FIFTH CAREER MACH 1 CHASSIS 358-360 SPRINT CAR OPEN VICTORY; YODER HOLDS OFF RINE FOR LATE MODEL WIN; MITCH & HOFFMAN SPLIT WINS IN PRO STOCKS; BISSINGER SWEEPS TWIN ROADRUNNER RACES

SELINSGROVE, Pa. – TJ Stutts of Liverpool drove to an unprecedented fifth

career victory in Saturday night's 30-lap 16th Annual Mach 1 Chassis National Open for 360 sprint cars at Selinsgrove Speedway.

Stutts' 25th career victory at the track in 358-360 sprint car racing was worth \$4,000 at the wheel of the family owned No. 23M.

Jim Yoder of Selinsgrove held off Jeff Rine of Danville for his first win of the season at the track in the 25-lap super late model main event. The win was the 13th of Yoder's late model racing career at Selinsgrove.

Brad Mitch of McClure and AJ Hoffman of Richfield each took a win in the twin 15-lap pro stock races, while Keith Bissinger of Orangeville swept the dual 12-lap roadrunner features.

Selinsgrove Speedway will be back in action at 7:30 p.m. Saturday, August 27, with the final points race of the season for the four weekly classes. Foss Jewelers Night will feature the 360 sprint cars, super late models, pro stocks, and roadrunners. There will also be a non-point makeup feature for the pro stocks from July 3.

The Craftsman World of Outlaws Late Model Series returns to Selinsgrove Speedway for the 18th Annual Jeff's Auto Body & Recycling Center Late Model National Open Sunday, Sept. 4. The 40-lap A-Main will pay \$8,000 to win. The limited late models will compete in a 20-lap feature paying \$1,000 to win over the Labor Day Holiday weekend.

Eric Tomecek took the race lead from Colby Wolmer on lap two and led the way early in the Mach 1 Chassis Open for the Newville Family of Companies 360 Sprint Cars. Tomecek was soon joined at the front by the four-time and defending winner of the event TJ Stutts. Stutts followed Tomecek until lap 13 when the race leader slowed to the infield with a problem. Stutts took over the top spot in a good position ahead of Josh Weller.

Yoder made a very bold outside move to go by not one lap car but both of the lap cars in front of him. That move put the lap traffic between Yoder and Rine for good as Yoder drove to his

first checkered flag of the season and the 13th of his career. Rine's charge came to an end with a second place run from 17th. Bryan Bernheisel charged into the top three late in the race from his mid-pack starting spot and finished third. Meade Hahn and Chris Casner also enjoyed top five finishes.

Donnie Schick, Danny Snyder, Steve Campbell, Matt Cochran, and Tony Adams finished out the top ten finishers. Heat race wins went to Yoder and Snyder.

Point leader Brad Mitch was not going to play it safe in the make-up feature for the A&A Auto Stores Pro Stocks to start the racing action on Saturday night. Mitch said he was here to win and win he did leading much of the 15 lap event. Mitch was not pressured after a big wreck on lap one produced the races only yellow flag.

Mitch enjoyed a three second plus lead over a tight battle for second between AJ Hoffman and John Troxell. The three would stay that way coming to the checkered flag. Joing Mitch, Hoffman, and Troxell in the top five were Matt Wilson and Brandon Moser.

In the regularly scheduled Pro Stock feature, John Troxell was thinking about his first win of the season as he led the early laps. Troxell was passed by AJ Hoffman on lap three, but that didn't change Troxell's plans. He continued to keep the pressure on the race leader for the next 10 laps before Brad Mitch took over second.

WORLD OF OUTLAWS LATE MODEL SERIES SUNDAY NIGHT (SEPT. 4) IN NATIONAL OPEN 410 SPRINT CARS TO CLOSE OUT SEASON SEPT. 17 IN JIM NACE MEMORIAL NATIONAL OPEN

SELINSGROVE, Pa. – The 360 sprint cars, super late models, pro stocks, and roadrunners returned to Selinsgrove Speedway Saturday night to complete the Aug. 27 features that were postponed due to a power outage that affected area communities and the speedway.

The features completed the regular points racing season at the Snyder County oval for 2016 with Mark Smith of Sunbury clinching the 360 sprint car title, Jeff Rine of Danville the super late model championship, Brad Mitch of McClure winning the pro stock division crown, and Keith Bissinger of Orangeville wrapping up the roadrunner title.

Jason Shultz of Carlisle and Hayes Mattern of Beavertown were first-time winners this season at the track in the 25-lap 360 sprint car and super late model main events, respectively. Tommy Slanker and AJ Hoffman of Richfield split the wins in the 15-lap pro stock races, while Keith Bissinger closed out the roadrunner racing season with a victory in the 12-lap main event.

Selinsgrove Speedway will be right back in action Sunday night over the Labor Day holiday (Sept. 4) with the Craftsman World of Outlaw Late Model series in the Jeff's Auto Body and Recycling Center Late Model National Open. The track's crown jewel event for the super Late Models will pay \$8,000 to win and run 40 laps. The Limited Late Models will also be on the night's racing card. Darrell Lanigan is the defending winner of the event and will look to extend his three-race winning streak in the Open.

Track gates open at 4p.m. for the Sept. 4 race. Adult admission to the grandstands will be \$30, students (12-17) \$10, and 11 and under are free. Pit Passes will be \$40.

The 2016 season will close out Saturday, Sept. 17, with the Jim Nace Memorial 34th Annual National Open for the 410 Sprint Cars. The Late Models will join the 410 Sprinters in the season finale at 7p.m.

The Selinsgrove Speedway season awards banquet will be held November 5 at the Genetti Hotel in Williamsport. Tickets will go on sale in September.

Colby Womer jumped into the race lead at the drop of the green flag in the 25-lap Newville Family of Companies 360 Sprint Car main event while Jason Shultz charged from his eighth starting spot. Eric Tomecek was quickly into second and Shultz had moved to third on lap four. Tomecek and Shultz made up a lot of ground on Womer as they approached lap traffic.

Tomecek was the first to go by Womer followed quickly by Shultz, who on the next lap, would go by Tomecek to secure the top spot. A red flag on lap 18 was the first time the race lost green flag status as Ryan Kissinger flipped. He escaped injury.

With the field bunched up for the restart, Tomecek used the restart to challenge Shultz a few times, but never more than in turns 3&4 on the final lap. Shultz got the run he needed to drive away to pick up his first win at the track in over two years. The checkered flag came over Tomecek, Derek Locke, Colby Womer, and Mike Walter. Michael Walter II recovered from an early race flat tire to finish in sixth. He raced across the line ahead of Eric Parker, Larry Kelleher, Darren Schott, and Charlie Anderson. Heat race wins on Aug. 27 went to Womer and Walter.

The Jeff's Auto Body and Recycling Center Super Late Model feature race was

the last chance for teams to tune up leading into the Sunday's World of Outlaw race. Hayes Mattern looked to kick the monkey off his back and take his first win of the season. Mattern jumped to the race lead from his front row starting spot. Bryan Bernheisel quickly looked to be the car to beat as he raced into the second position from his seventh starting spot. By lap 20 Bernheisel had pulled to the rear bumper of Mattern's number 9.

Soon the race for the lead was into lap traffic and Bernheisel really put the pressure on Mattern. With two to go Mattern made a bold move around two lap cars that left a gap between he and Bernheisel. Bernheisel was not done yet. He closed the lead up enough that in the final corner he could pull even with Mattern coming to the checkered flag. The two made contact out of turn four as the drag race to the finish began. Mattern held on by just .025 seconds for the win. Bernheisel earned a hard fought second place. Tony Adams closed out the podium finishers ahead of Jeff Rine and Steve Campbell. Matt Cochran, Luke Hoffner, Jim Yoder, Dave Zona, and Save Stamm made up the rest of the top ten finishers. Bernheisel and Cochran were the heat race winners on Aug. 27.

When the green flag came out in the A&A Auto Stores Pro Stock main event, Brad Mitch locked up the 2016 Pro Stock points' championship. Mitch looked to end the championship bid with a victory when he took the race lead away from Brandon Moser on lap 5. Tommy Slanker had other ideas of how the season would end. Slanker used an inside line to go by Mitch on a lap 11 restart and opened up a lead. A yellow flag came out again on laps 14 setting up a one lap shootout for the win.

Slanker showed the way into turn three when Mitch threw a big slide job going for the win. Slanker was able to make the move back into the race lead to grab his second win of the season. Moser was actually able to sneak under Mitch for second while Mitch settled for the third spot. AJ Hoffman and Curtis Lawton were the rest of the drivers in the top five. Nate Herman finished sixth followed by Shaun Lawton, Lori Croop, Matt Wilson, and John Troxell. Hoffman and Stroup were winners in the heat races.

Keith Bissinger has claimed all but three wins this year in the A&A Auto Stores Roadrunners. Saturday night he hoped to celebrate his championship run with a victory. Bissinger led much of the feature event, but a late race yellow gave runner up Brian Johnson a chance to grab the race lead away. Bissinger admitted he was running lower on the speedway thinking the inside was faster, but Johnson was making the outside line work. Johnson pulled even with Bissinger going into turn one of the final lap and then crossed over the race leader coming to the checkered flag. At the flag stand the drag race finish went in favor of Bissinger. Johnson was second ahead of early race leader Will Brunson. Tom Underwood and Smith cope were fourth and fifth. Butch Shaffer, Cory Collier, Dustin Snook, Miranada Minium, and Jim Collier rounded out the top ten finishers.

In the night cap the Pro Stocks returned to complete a feature event from July 3rd.

AJ Hoffman took the race lead early and dominated the 15 lap feature. The win moved him into sole possession of the number one slot of the Pro Stock win list. The win was Hoffman's 46th career victory. Matt Wilson followed him across the line along with Nate Stroup, Peanut Heintzelman, and Bill Conrad.

SELINSGROVE, Pa. -- Sunday marked the 18th running of the Jeff's Auto Body and Recycling

Center Late Model National Open at Selinsgrove Speedway with the World of Outlaw Late Models joining central Pennsylvania's best to challenge the superspeedway of dirt track racing.

Quick time for the Craftsman World of Outlaw Late Models went to Coleby Frye with a time of 19.657 over 42 entries.

Billy Moyer Jr. and Rick Eckert brought the 24-car field to the green flag for the start of the 40-lap, \$8,000-to-win Open. Moyer led lap number one with Eckert in chase and a hard-charging Coley Frye working his way to the front.

SELINSGROVE, Pa. -- Lucas Wolfe of Mechananicsburg entered Selinsgrove Speedway Saturday for time trials and laid down the quickest lap of the night at 16.353 seconds. That would be an indication of what was to come for the 410 Sprint Car field in attendance for the Jim Nace Memorial 34th Annual National Open. Wolfe, the 2005 winner of the event, qualified from his heat race to lock into the main event, and he would lead the field to the green flag for 30 laps and go on to set a new track record for the distance in 9:21.300, eclipsing the record held by Doug Wolfgang since 1985.

By lap five Wolfe was already catching the tail of the field and began to maneuver through lap traffic. Wolfe showed the way over Hodnett, Ryan Smith, Blane Heimbach, and TJ Stutts as lap sixth flashed onto the score board.

The distance between Wolfe and Hodnett shrunk and grew over the first 15 laps of the race as the field took half way. Brent Marks worked his way into the top five on lap 18 as he drove by Stutts.

By lap 20, Wolfe was into the thicker lap traffic and Hodnett began to cut into what was almost a three second lead. Only three laps later Hodnett was within a second of the race leader and continuing to close in.

Wolfe worked into the top ten running cars putting cars a lap down at a rapid pace as the race wound down. As the cars got more competitive going a lap down Hodnett chose his spot to attack.

Hodnett pulled within ten car lengths of Wolfe with the two to go sign displayed, but never got close enough to seriously challenge Wolfe as he drove to his second National Open win in record-setting time.

"We were good all night long," said Wolfe in victory lane. "You know you had a good car when you're lapping that far into the field. Danny (Dietrich) has two wins here this season and we were catching him to lap at the end."

Wolfe's first win of the season at the Super Speedway of Dirt Track Racing came on an \$8,000 pay day. Hodnett, Smith, Marks, and Heimbach were the top five finishers. Doug Esh was sixth followed by TJ Stutts, Aaron Ott, Jason Shultz, and Danny Dietrich.

Heat races for the 22 car field were won by Dietrich, Marks, and Stutts.

It's not often that a winner in the Jeff's Auto Body and Recycling Center Late Models comes from outside the top ten. Dylan Yoder did just that in the final race of the 2016 season. Yoder came from the 13th starting spot to claim the victory.

Mike Lupfer led the race early on before being passed by Donnie Schick. Schick led until a lap five restart when Andy Haus went by. Haus set the pace on the outside of the race track for the next ten laps. The outside line proved to be tricky when Haus made contact with the third turn wall allowing Lupfer, Kyle Hardy, and a hard charging Yoder to move to his rear bumper. A caution flag came out for a Kyle Rhoads tire blow out to stop the battle right as Yoder pulled even with the race leader after passing Lupfer for second the corner before.

On the restart, Haus slide high and that allowed Yoder to bolt into the race lead for good. Any doubt about whether or not Yoder had anything left to offer the front runners after charging through the field was gone as Yoder pulled away to the win.

Yoder's win came over Lupfer, Hardy, Haus, and Brian Bernheisel. Schick crossed the line sixth followed by Tim Wilson, Jeff Rine, Hayes Mattern, and Jeremy Miller.

Andy Haus, Hayes Mattern, and Danny Snyder took heat races wins in the racing for 24 cars.
