REINHARDT, FRYE, MOSER & COPE TAKE SELINSGROVE SPEEDWAY OPENING DAY WINS

SELINSGROVE, Pa. -- Selinsgrove Speedway opened the 2019 season on Saturday night. Kyle Reinhardt of Neptune City, N.J., driving for John Westbrook, picked up his first career win at the speedway in the 25-lap 360 sprint car event.

Coleby Frye, of Dover, wired the field for the win in the 25-lap model feature. It was Frye's 21st career win at the Snyder County oval.

Reinhardt and Frye both collected \$2,200 for their Opening Day victories.

Brandon Moser, of Middleburg, and Smith Cope, of Danville, also wired the field for their opening night wins in the 15-lap pro stock and 12-lap roadrunner main events, respectively.

Selinsgrove Speedway returns to racing action at 6 p.m. Saturday, April 13, with another four division show featuring the Keller's Auto Body & Towing 360 sprint cars, Jeff's Auto Body & Recycling super late models, and the A&A Auto Stores pro stocks and roadrunners. Track gates open at 4 p.m.

Mallie Schuster and Cody Keller got together in the first turn at the start of the sprint car feature with both cars flipping and bringing out the red flag immediately. Both drivers were uninjured.

Outside front row starter Davie Franek swept around the outside of the track to take the lead from polesitter Derek Locke with Mark Smith Jason Schultz and Kyle Reinhardt in hot pursuit.

On the fourth circuit, fourth-place starter Reinhardt made the winning pass by Franek in turn one. Lap eight brought out the caution flag for a car slowing on the speedway wiping out a 2.6 second lead. Smith used the restart to take third from Locke as Reinhardt again started to build a sizable lead.

At the halfway point, Reinhardt was leading Franek, Smith, Locke, and Shultz. Smith used the low side of turns three and four to take second from Franek who then slowed to a stop with a flat.

Smith pressured Reinhardt at the start but could not keep pace with him. Reinhardt beat Smith to the finish line by 3.4 seconds. Locke, Jason Schultz and Chad Layton rounded out the top five.

Sprint car heats went to Smith and Schultz.

Second-place starter Coleby Frye rocketed into the lead of the start of the late model feature and was followed by polesitter and defending champion Bryan Bernheisel, Justin Weaver, Brett Schadel and Danny Snyder were in close pursuit.

Frye, who is back driving his own F1 number racer, immediately went to the high side of the speedway.

John Myers spun and clipped the first turn fence bringing out the caution flag on lap seven.

Frye again assumed the lead over Bernheisel as the pair drove away from the field. Lap 11 saw the yellow flag unfurl again as Kyle Lee and Meade Hahn spun in the second turn.

Frye led the rest of the distance, despite some additional caution flags winning over Bernheisel by 2.9 seconds. Schadel, Snyder and Jim Bernheisel finished in the top five.

Late model heats were won by Bryan Bernheisel, Frye and Schadel.

Fourth-place starter Brandon Moser took the early lead in the pro stock feature and was followed by Shaun Lawton, Kyle Bachman, Corey Long and Brad Myers. Moser built up a lead but by lap eight Lawton was on his rear bumper looking for the lead.

The caution flew on lap 11 slowing the field. On the restart Moser continued to lead with Lawton stalking him but Moser took the checkered flag, .322 second in front of Lawton, Bachman, Long and Myers.

Pro stock heats were won by, Moser and Lawton.

Polesitter Smith Cope took the lead in the roadrunner feature and was followed by Will Brunson, Jason Zook, Curtis Lawton and Brian Mabus.

A lap five caution was disastrous for Brunson who slowed on the track bringing out the caution on the next lap.

Cope spent the rest of the race holding off the charge of Zook around the high side of the speedway but Cope, despite the fact that he didn't have brakes, slid up to close the door and take the checkered flag over Zook, Lawton, Mabus and Tom Underwood.

SHULTZ, RINE, BACHMAN & JONES TAKE WEEK TWO WINS AT SELINSGROVE

SELINSGROVE, Pa. -- Third starting Jason Shultz of Carlise took the lead on lap four and won his first 360 sprint car race of the season and 19th career in Saturday night's 25-lap main event at Selinsgrove Speedway.

Jeff Rine of Danville was victorious for the 109th time in his career at the track in the 25-lap super late model feature.

Shultz and Rine collected \$2,000 for their victories in the second week of action this season at the speedway.

Defending pro stock champion Kyle Bachman of Selinsgrove won the 15-lap pro stock race. It was his 51st win in the division and his 62nd win overall at the track

Jake Jones of Hunlock Creek added his name to drivers that have won on the 1/5th mile Selinsgrove Raceway Park inner oval and on the big half mile picking up the 12-lap roadrunner race with a last lap pass.

Selinsgrove Speedway returns to racing action at 6 p.m. Saturday April 20, with another four division show featuring the United Racing Club/Keller's Auto body 360 sprint cars, Jeff's Auto Body & Recycling super later models and the A&A Auto Stores pro stocks and roadrunners. Track gates open at 4 p.m.

Ryan Kissinger flew around the top of the racetrack to take the sprint car lead. Jason Shultz grabbed second from the second row and they were followed by Jimmy Stitzel, Colby Womer and Derek Locke in the early laps.

Ryan Stillwaggon spun in turn three bringing out the yellow flag on lap three.

Shultz dove under Kissinger for the lead but Kissinger horsepowered his way back to the front down the back stretch. Going into turn one on the following lap Schultz made the same move but was able to hold of Kissinger for the top spot.

"I was really uncomfortable on the restart and was just hanging on." Schultz said. "It was a little better once I got out front but Ryan (Kissinger) was really pressing."

Lap eight saw Colby Womer slow on the speedway, bringing out the caution again.

Shultz and Kissinger raced the next lap side by side but Stitzel spun in the second turn again slowing the field. The restarts allowed Chad Layton and last week's winner Kyle Reinhardt to enter the top five.

Derek Locke found some speed on the restart and on lap 10 took over the runner up position.

By the midway point, Shultz held a second and a half lead while the battle was on for second between Kissinger, Locke and Layton when Locke and Layton got together and spun on the front stretch. With the two front runners going to the rear, Davie Franek and Adam Carberry slid into third and fourth. Reinhardt and Cody Keller quickly got by Carberry for fourth and fifth.

Franek pressured Kissinger and got by him for second on lap 21 but was not able to challenge the high flying Schultz who won by 2.86 seconds over Franek, Kissinger, Keller and Carberry.

Sprint car heats went to Colby Womer and Adam Carberry.

Dan Snyder took the late model feature lead from the outside pole and was followed by Jeff Rine, Jim Yoder, Shawn Jones and Kenny Trevitz.

Jim Yoder brought out the caution when he rolled to a stop on the third lap.

Rine flew around the top of turns one and two to take the lead on the restart.

Chris Casner, Brett Schadel, Meade Hahn and Austin Berry tangled in turn two to bring out the yellow flag on lap six. Hahn, Schadel and Casner were able to rejoin the field.

Rine again took off but last week's winner Coleby Frye was soon in third right on Snyder's tail. Frye grabbed second coming off the fourth turn on the high side.

Cody Lyter stopped on the track wiping out a 3.9 second lead for Rine and put Frye right on his rear bumper.

Rine slid high in turn three allowing Frye to get inside him. Frye slid up and got into Rine but the pair continued down the front stretch.

"Whew!" Rine exclaimed. "That was some tough racing. It was rough in the turn and Coleby got under me. That was tough."

Dan Green's car quit in the third turn on lap 21 setting up yet another Rine, Frye restart that didn't happen as six cars piled up in the second turn blocking the track, bringing out the red flag. No drivers were injured.

Another three car incident on the restart kept the field under caution.

Snyder cooled his tires under caution and got back by Frye for second but never challenged for the lead

Rine ran the rest of the distance out front winning by 3.7 seconds over Snyder, Jones, Trevitz and Schadel.

Late model heats were won by Jim Yoder, Dan Snyder and Dave Stamm.

Kyle Bachman grabbed the pro stock lead from the pole and then just about spun in the third turn. Bachman held on but it allowed last week's winner Brandon Moser to take second from Shaun Lawton, Corey Long and John Schoch.

Late in the race Moser drew to the back of Bachman when the caution came out for Lori Croop on lap 13, setting up a green, white, checkered finish.

Bachman ran the rest of the distance with Moser and Lawton on his tail but held on for the win, by .452 seconds over Moser, Lawton, Long and Schoch.

The pro stock heat was won by Kyle Bachman

Will Brunson took the roadrunner lead followed by Jake Jones, Curtis Lawton, Brian Mabus and Terry Kramer.

Jones pressured Brunson and took the lead on lap three. Brunson stayed right on his tail as the pair raced away from the field.

Brunson got back in front on lap nine when Jones slid high in the second turn. Coming off the last turn Brunson slid high and Jones regained the lead for the win. Lawton, Kramer and Mabus rounded out the top five.

The roadrunner heats were won by Jake Jones and Will Brunson

KISSINGER, MATTERN, MOSER & BRUNSON TAKE SATURDAY NIGHT VICTORIES ON "GLASS-TOP-SMOOTH" SELINSGROVE SPEEDWAY SURFACE

SELINSGROVE, Pa. -- An April storm cloud delayed the heats at the Selinsgrove Speedway Saturday night with a shower but all it did was make the fast, smooth track even faster.

Ryan Kissinger of Bloomsburg was the winner in the United Racing Club 25-lap 360 sprint car feature. Hayes Mattern of Beavertown won the 25-lap late model feature. Both earned \$2,000 for their victories in the third racing event of the season at the track.

Pro stock point leader Brandon Moser of Middleburg was the season's first repeat winner in the division's 15-lap race, while Will Brunson of Middleburg picked up his first feature win of the year in the 12-lap roadrunner race.

The speedway will return to action at 6 p.m. on Sunday, April 28, with the Icon Legacy Custom Modular Homes Ray Tilley Classic for 410 sprint cars, Grit House Route 35 Super Late Model Challenge Series and roadrunners. Track gates will open at 4 p.m. The speedway will be dark Saturday, April 27.

Cody Keller and Ryan Kissinger shot past polesitter Kyle Reinhardt who faltered at the start in the 360 sprint car feature. The pair was followed by Chad Layton, Reinhardt and Adam Carberry.

The red flew on lap three when rookie Jake Hummel flipped in the third turn. Brian Nornhold, Todd Gracey and Troy Betts were also involved. All drivers were uninjured.

Carberry went around the outside to try an improve his position on the restart but spun bringing the yellow out.

Kissinger ducked under Keller, in turn three, on the restart and took over the lead. Two laps later

Layton moved by Keller into the runnerup position.

As Kissinger sliced through traffic, Reinhardt, who had regained the third position drew to the rear of Layton's racer. The pair danced through traffic as Kissinger drove away.

Kissinger, who races a Ford engine, had a decided power advantage and ran the rest of the distance untouched to defeat, Layton, Reinhardt, Keller and Josh Weller.

Sprint car heats were won by Weller, Reinhardt and Ed Aiken.

Hayes Mattern rocketed to the front of the late model feature and was followed by Donnie Schick, Jim Yoder, Bryan Bernheisel and Coleby Frye.

Through the middle part of the race, veterans Schick and Yoder were battling for second as the youngster Mattern drove away and hid.

By lap 14 Yoder got the better of Schick and raced to the second position while Randy Christine took over fourth.

In the final laps, Mattern had problems with lapped traffic and almost spun in turn one. Mattern's issues helped Yoder, who in the final laps was glued to Mattern's rear bumper.

Mattern was able to hang on as he took the checkered flag by .84 seconds over Yoder, Schick Christine and Frye.

Late model heats went to Schick and Mattern.

Point leader Brandon Moser passed Shaun Lawton on the backstretch and went on to take the pro stock feature over Lawton, Kyle Bachman, John Schoch and Ray Rothfuss.

Moser and Rothfuss won the pro stock heats.

Will Brunson passed last week's winner Jake Jones on the first lap of the roadrunner feature. They were followed by Terry Kramer, Tom Underwood and Jimmy Kessler.

Brunson who gave up the lead last week, late in the race drove the distance to the checkered flag over Jones, Kramer, Underwood and Kessler,

Darren Rice was the roadrunner heat winner.

SELINSGROVE SPEEDWAY BATTLES ANOTHER RAINY WEEKEND: SHULTZ, SCHADEL, MOSER & JONES TAKE CHECKERED FLAGS

SELINSGROVE, Pa. - Jason Shultz of Carlisle won the 25-lap 360 sprint car feature from the 16th starting spot at Selinsgrove Speedway Saturday night. The victory was Shultz's second of the season and 20th career at the Snyder County half-mile oval.

Brett Schadel of Herndon was victorious in the 25-lap late model race. It was Schadel's third career win in a super late model at the speedway. Both Shultz and Schadel received the top prize of \$2000 for their victories.

Brandon Moser of Middleburg won the 15-lap pro stock race, while Jake Jones of Hunlock Creek took the 12-lap roadrunner nightcap.

The Selinsgrove Speedway will be back in action at 7 p.m. next Saturday May 18, when the super late models will race 52 laps in the Ron Keister Memorial paying \$11,000 to win out of the huge \$40,000 purse. The 360 sprint cars and pro stocks will also be in action. All track gates will open at 4 p.m.

For the second week in a row a shower started as the sprint cars were pushed to the speedway. The cars returned to the pits as it showered harder. Like they did last week the track crew went right to work and saved the track.

Mark Smith split the front row starters to rocket to the front of the sprint car feature followed by Cody Keller, Kyle Reinhardt, Derek Locke and Michael Walter. Curt Stoup brought out the caution on lap eight when he slowed on the speedway.

Reinhardt got a great restart and took second from Keller but the field was again slowed on lap 11 when Ryan Kissinger and Locke stopped on the track.

The restart saw Jason Shultz get by Keller and immediately pressure Reinhardt. Shultz moved into second one lap later and started to track down Smith. "We really got a good start on the second one." Shultz stated. "We could go high or low."

Smith looked unbeatable but in the final laps a puff of smoke ended Smith's evening as he stopped on the back stretch handing the lead to Shultz. Shultz led the final circuit winning by .495 seconds over Reinhardt, Keller Chad Layton and Walter.

"When I saw the smoke coming out of Mark's car I knew it was not good. I just wanted to be in a different lane in case something happened." Shultz said. "It's too bad for Mark but we'll take it."

Sprint car heats were won by Chad Layton and Cody Keller.

Donnie Schick led Brett Schadel into the first turn at the start of the late model feature. The pair were followed by Jim Yoder, Bryan Bernheisel, Jeff Rine and Colby Frye.

Schadel passed Schick on lap four for the lead and Bernheisel followed into the runner up spot.

"Randy (Keister) guessed right and put on a soft tire." Schadel said. "We knew Colby (Frye) and (Jeff) Rine would go a little harder. We wanted to get the lead early and try to hold them off."

A lap nine restart gave Rine a shot at Bernheisel which he used to grab second. Frye soon followed into third. Frye and Rine entertained the fans with some high speed cat and mouse as Schadel continued to lead.

Frye and Rine raced lap 20 side by side before Frye grabbed second. A lap later Rine was back underneath but Frye used a lapped car as a pick to maintain second.

The battle for second played into Schadel's hands as he rolled to .84 second win.

"By lap nine our right rear tire was shot." Schadel continued. "I used the cushion to turn the car. The track was great tonight."

Following Schadel and Rine were Ross Robinson, Bernheisel and Randy Christine.

Late model heats went to Hayes Mattern, Yoder and Bernheisel.

Lori Croop took the pro stock feature lead from the pole position and was followed by Shaun Lawton, John Troxell, Tommy Dawson and Brandon Moser. By the third lap, Lawton had taken the lead with Moser on his tail.

Making his first start of the season AJ Hoffman was soon in third and joined the battle for the lead. As Hoffman and Moser traded slide jobs, Lawton opened the lead. Once Hoffman was clear of Moser he quickly tracked down Lawton when the yellow came out on lap 10.

Hoffman used the restart and the high side of the speedway to take the lead. One lap later, Moser followed into the runner up spot. Moser tested Hoffman and found some grip coming off the second turn. He shot around Hoffman going into the third turn and came off the fourth turn with the lead and the win. Hoffman, Lawton, Kyle Bachman and Cory Long rounded out the top five.

Dawson and Moser won the pro stock heats.

Jake Jones took the lead on the final lap over Will Brunson to win the roadrunner feature. Curtis Lawton, Jason Zook and Bob Bussey rounded out the top five. Jones had also won last night in a kart on the inner Selinsgrove Raceway Park oval.

Mason Ziegler of Chalk Hill looked like he was going to make his four hour tow payoff in a big way Saturday night at Selinsgrove Speedway but it was Rick Eckert of York who made a late-race pass on the 49th of 52 laps to take the win and \$11,000 that was posted for the Ron Keister Memorial for super late models.

Keister, a rookie driver who was killed in April of 1976, was honored by the speedway and his family.

The victory was Eckert's seventh career at the famed Snyder County half-mile oval.

Michael Walter of Selinsgrove scored his first career 360 sprint car win in the 25-lap feature that

was worth \$2,000.

Kyle Bachman of Selinsgrove capped off the night with his second win of the season in the 15-lap pro stock feature.

Selinsgrove Speedway returns to action at 7 p.m. next Saturday, May 25th, with the United Racing Club Jack Gunn Memorial for 360 sprint cars along with limited late models, pro stocks and roadrunners. Track gates will open at 5 p.m.

Starting on the pole in what was his first ever race at Selinsgrove Speedway, Mason Ziegler slid underneath Coleby Frye for the early lead in the late model race. The pair were followed by Rick Eckert, Randy Christine Jr. and Kyle Hardy.

In the early laps, Eckert got by Frye as Hardy followed. By lap 10 Ziegler had run into traffic and Eckert drew to his rear bumper. Hardy and Greg Satterlee soon joined the front runners.

Ziegler continued to slice through traffic while Eckert, a former World of Outlaw Champion stayed in contact but did not pressure him. Satterlee got by Hardy for third and was soon tracking down Eckert.

With the first 41 laps run without a caution, a planned competition yellow was thrown to allow for an 11 lap shootout in honor of Keister's former car number.

The cars restarted using the Delaware restart with Ziegler choosing the bottom lane. As Ziegler took off, Dylan Yoder used the restart to drive into third. Eckert stayed glued to Ziegler's bumper and tried to test him high but on the 49th lap Ziegler came off the fourth turn high. Eckert drove low and into the lead.

Almost immediately the caution came out as Jeff Rine, Ken Moreland, Jim Yoder and Shaun Jones got together in the third turn.

After a lengthy caution because a bumper got caught in the guardrail the race resumed for a green-white-checkered showdown.

Eckert checked out winning by .448 seconds over Ziegler, Yoder, Satterlee and Jared Miley.

Late model heats went to Ziegler, Alex Feree, Eckert and Frye. The B-Mains were won by Kenny Trevitz and Gene Knaub. Satterlee set fast time of 19.355 seconds over the 36-car field.

Mallie Schuster rocketed into the sprint car lead from the pole position. He was followed by Derek Locke, Michael Walter, Jason Shultz and Kyle Reinhardt.

Locke took the lead on the next go around and the race was cautioned on lap three for a spin by Dave McGough and Jim Schuster.

Walter, Schuster, and Shultz raced the next lap three wide before Walter grabbed second and Schultz settled into third.

Shultz running low and Walter racing high in a side by side race allowed Locke to open a lead by over four seconds when he slowed and pulled off the track on lap 19.

"I saw him go low and pull in." Walter said. "My engine was getting hot and I was hoping it would hold up just a few more laps. We've tried and failed so many times it feels great to win this one."

Walter was followed by Shultz, Layton, Reinhardt and Mallie Schuster.

The win was Walter's first at the speedway after starting his career on the 1/5th mile inner oval and the third generation of his family to race at the speedway.

Sprint car heats were won by Locke and Layton

Shaun Lawton blasted to the front of the pro stock feature followed by Kyle Bachman, Brandon Moser, AJ Hoffman and Tommy Dawson.

Bachman pulled even with Lawton and the pair ran side by side until lap eight when Bachman inched into the lead.

A last lap caution for Dawson and Wayne Shaffer bunched the field on Bachman's rear but the defending track champion won his second race of the season over Moser, Lawton, Hoffman and AJ Stroup.

Kyle Bachman and Brandon Moser won the pro stock heats.

Front row starter Bryan Bernheisel won the drag race down the fron stretch to take the late model lead over polesitter Rick Eckert, Jason Covert, Gene Knaub, Tyler Horst, and Brett Schadel.

The top three ran the first third of the race nose to tail but on lap 12 Eckert used a lapped car to pick off Bernheisel and take the lead as the pair came off turn four. Two laps later, it was Covert taking over second.

SHULTZ HOLDS OFF LOCKE FOR WHITCOMB MEMORIAL SPRINT THRILLER; HAUS MAKES LATE-RACE PASS BY DICKSON FOR LATE MODEL CHECKERS; LAWTON GOES BACK-TO-BACK IN PRO STOCKS; SNOOK RETURNS TO ROADRUNNER VICTORY

SELINSGROVE, Pa. -- Jason Shultz of Carlisle defeated a star-studded field of Patriot 360 sprint cars to win the \$2,271 top prize in the 25-lap Joe Whitcomb Memorial Saturday night at Selinsgrove Speedway.

Shultz, driving the Horstcraft Millworks No. 29, recorded his third win of the year and was also the night's Fast Tees Fast Qualifier over the 25-car field with a lap time of 16.726, a new track record for the 360 sprint cars.

Andy Haus of Hamburg made a late-race pass for his \$2,000 win in the 25-lap super late model race. Haus became the seventh different late model feature winner in as many races at the speedway this season.

Shaun Lawton of Bloomsburg wired the pro stock field for his second win in a row in the division's 15-lap race, while Dustin Snook of McClure returned to Victory Lane for the first time in two years in the 12-lap roadrunner feature.

Selinsgrove Speedway will be back in action at 7:30 p.m. Saturday, June 22 with the United Racing Club-sanctioned 30-lap Kramer Cup for 360 sprint cars plus super late models, Mid-Atlantic modifieds, and pro stocks sponsored by Reinhart Food Service. Gates will open at 5:00 pm.

Derek Locke shot into the sprint car feature lead from the pole and was followed by, Jason Shultz, Mallie Schuster, Cody Keller and Kyle Reinhardt.

A lap one red flag came out when Brian Nornhold slammed the fourth turn wall and flipped. Nornhold was uninjured.

When the race resumed Locke and Shultz checked out. Shultz stalked Locke and on lap seven rolled high in the second turn and took the lead.

Schuster, Reinhardt and Keller entertained the fans with a great battled for third. Reinhardt got by Keller and was all over Shuster as the pair sliced through lapped traffic.

In the closing laps, Locke again drew to the back of Shultz as Shuster tracked down Locke but it was Shultz winning by .749 seconds over Locke, Shuster, Keller and Reinhardt.

Sprint car heats were won by Davie Franek, Jared Zimbardi, and Reinhardt. Shultz set a new track record in time trials of 16.762 seconds.

Front row starter Nick Dickson grabbed the late model lead down the backstretch over Andy Haus, Tim Wilson, Donnie Schick and Kenny Trevitz. A big pileup on the back stretch brought out

the red flag as the track was blocked. Dave Brouse Jr., Jeff Rine, Dave Zona, Dylan Yoder, Nathan Long and Mike Lupfer were all involved with several cars towed from the scene.

As the top three started to open up a lead, Coleby Frye was moving up from the back of the pack. As Dickson worked the traffic Haus drew to his rear bumper and on lap 18 drove under Dickson for the lead in turn two.

Once in front, Haus was never headed beating Dickson by 1.298 seconds. Wilson, Schick and Randy Christine rounded out the top five.

Dickson, Haus and Frye won late model heat races. Mike Lupfer won the B-Main.

With the top two drivers in the point standings unable to start the feature, Shaun Lawton, third in points, jumped into the lead at the waving of the green flag to start the pro stock feature. He was followed by Lori Croop, AJ Stroup, AJ Hoffman and John Schoch.

As Lawton checked out, Croop and Stroup battled for the runner up spot until Croop spun and slammed the inside wall bringing out the red flag. Croop walked away from the incident.

Lawton led the rest of the distance winning by 2.411seconds over Stroup, Hoffman, Schoch and Corey Long

SELINSGROVE, Pa. – Ryan Smith of Kunkletown showed up at Selinsgrove Speedway Saturday with his eye on the coveted Kramer Cup trophy and took it home with him after a wire-to-wire victory in the 30-lap tribute race honoring the memory of the late Hall of Fame sprint car driver Kramer Williamson.

Smith, at the wheel of the Heffner Racing/Red Robin No. 72, also ended up with \$3,937 in prize money including contingencies.

Coleby Frye of Dover became the first repeat super late model feature winner of the year in the 25-lap, \$2,000-to-win race.

Shaun Lawton of Bloomsburg pulled off the hat trick with his third consecutive win in the 15-lap pro stock feature, while Brad Kling of Mount Union won the 20-lap Mid-Atlantic modified feature in the division's only appearance of the season at the track.

Selinsgrove Speedway will be back in action with a two-race weekend on Saturday, June 29, and Sunday, June 30.

Saturday night's race will feature the 360 sprint cars, super late models, pro stocks, and roadrunners on the track's annual Kids Night sponsored by the Sunbury Eagles Club. The speedway returns Sunday night at 7:30 p.m. with the Middleswarth Potato Chips Jan Opperman/Dick Bogar Memorial PA Speedweek race for 410 sprint cars plus 305 sprint cars. Track gates will open at 4 p.m.

Ryan Smith blasted into the sprint car lead from the pole and was followed by Troy Betts, Michael Water, Curt Michael and Chad Layton. The caution flew on lap two for Kyle Reinhardt.

Walter got a jump on Betts on the restart and moved to second leaving Betts and Michael to battle for third.

Smith, a veteran who spent several years with the ARDC Midgets and All Star Sprint Cars, sliced his way through the traffic opening a straightaway lead but in the waning laps started to slow.

CISNEY WINS ROUND THREE OF THE PA SPRINT CAR SPEEDWEEK SERIES SUNDAY NIGHT AT SELINSGROVE SPEEDWAY; DUKE SCORES 305 SPRINT CAR VICTORY

SELINSGROVE, Pa. -- Dylan Cisney towed up Route 35 from Port Royal to take his first career win at Selinsgrove Speedway Sunday night in round three of the nine-race Pennsylvania Sprint Car Speedweek Series.

The victory in the 30-lap Opperman/Bogar Memorial was worth \$5,000 at the wheel of the Valley Supply No. 5.

Danny Dietrich of Gettysburg was the Fast Tees Fast Qualifier over the 26-car field with a lap time of 18.057.

Ken Duke of Selinsgrove powered to his first career win on the half-mile track in the 20-lap 305 sprint car main event.

Both winners of the open wheel doubleheader Sundaynight got their racing starts in go karts and micro sprint cars on the speedway's smaller one-fifth mile track.

Selinsgrove Speedway will be back in action at 7:30 p.m. this Thursday, July 4, with a special mid-week show featuring Firecracker 30-lap features for both the 360 sprint cars and super late models paying \$3,000 to win. The pro stocks and roadrunners will also be on the holiday racing card. Track gates will open at 5 p.m.

There will be no racing at the track on Saturday, July 6.

Track officials made a huge announcement Sunday night that the Jim Nace Memorial 37th Annual National Open for the 410 sprint cars on Saturday, Sept. 14, will pay \$20,000 to win.

A multi-car melee unfolded as the field charged off the fourth turn to take the green flag at the start of the 410 sprint car feature, collecting Danny Dietrich, Ryan Smith, Freddie Rahmer, Mike Walter and Kyle Moody with all but Dietrich able to rejoin the race.

Polesitter Blane Heimbach shot to the front when the race got restarted. He was followed by Dylan Cisney, Kyle Reinhardt, Lucas Wolfe and Tony Stewart.

Reinhardt smacked the second turn wall on lap three bringing out the caution flag.

Heimbach opened a lead while the battle on the track was for third between defending race winner Wolfe and Stewart. Heimbach had built up a three-second lead by the time he drove into lapped traffic and by the midway point Stewart had started to make a charge to the front and was dogging Cisney for second.

Stewart shot into second on lap 17 coming off the fourth turn but Cisney battled back for the position.

The red flag came out when Ryan Smith, who had returned to the field after the first lap crash, lost his top wing and crashed hard into the first turn fence. A palpable silence hung over the speedway until it was announced the popular Smith was all right and a loud cheer from the fans broke the silence.

A lengthy break was needed to clean up the fuel that was spilled. During the stop, Heimbach changed his wing and was sent to the back of the pack, handing the lead to Cisney.

Wolfe used the outside lane on the restart to get by Stewart for the runner up position while Brock Zearfoss took over third. He and Stewart performed a high-speed dance around the speedway as Cisney drove away.

"That race belonged to Heimbach and it's too bad what happened but I'd rather be lucky than good." Cisney said. "Back in 2002 my dad and I stood here after my first kart win so this is unbelievable. I got some new sponsors this year and it has allowed us to travel a little bit but I'm still not good on little tracks so it feels good to get back here."

Cisney beat Stewart by 1.5 seconds followed by Wolfe, Zearfoss and Anthony Macri.

Macri, Cisney and Heimbach won the 410 sprint car heats. Jared Esh won the B-Main.

Ken Duke blasted to the lead in the 305 sprint car feature and was followed by Cale Reigle, Larry McVay, Jake Waters, and Kruz Kepner. Kepner spun on the first lap, bringing out the yellow flag. Ryan Lynn started his charge up through the field and on the sixth lap had second spot in his pocket. Taking the long way around, Lynn started to close on Duke.

Landon Wood spun and slowly rolled on his side to bring out the red on lap 10.

In the waning laps as Duke drove away Dave Grube and Cale Reigle battled for third with Devin Adams soon joining the fray.

After wining many kart and micro races at Raceway Park, Duke claimed his first Selinsgrove big track win over Adams, Reigel, Grube and Rumsey.

MILEY SCORES LATE MODEL SHOWDOWN OVER STAR-STUDDED FIELD; ADAMS TAKES FIRST CAREER SELINSGROVE 305 SPRINT CAR WIN; MOSER & JONES RACE TO PRO STOCK & ROADRUNNER CHECKERS

SELINSGROVE, Pa. -- Jared Miley of Pittsburgh extended his points lead in the Ultimate Northeast Late Model Series with his \$3,000 win in Saturday night's 30-lap Showdown on Sand Hill at Selinsgrove Speedway.

The victory was Miley's second of the season in the series and his first career at Selinsgrove Speedway. He became the 11th different winner in 12 races this season in the super late model division, making it one of the most competitive seasons in late model history at the track.

Jason Covert of York was the night's fast qualifier over the star-studded 33-car field with a lap time of 19.255.

Lebanon's Devin Adams won the 20-lap PASS/IMCA 305 sprint car feature.

Brandon Moser of Middleburg won the 15-lap pro stock race and Jake Jones of Hunlock Creek was the winner of the 12-lap roadrunner race.

Selinsgrove Speedway is back in action at 7:30 p.m. Saturday, Aug. 17, with the 360 sprint cars, limited late models, pro stocks, and annual Roadrunner 20 championship race. Track gates will open at 5 p.m.

Dylan Yoder and Greg Satterlee led the field to the start of the Ultimate Northeast Late Model Series feature, with Satterlee rocketing to the lead. Jason Covert, Gene Knaub, and Jared Miley were in the top five.

Satterlee, who won on Friday at Path Valley Speedway, saw a nice lead wiped out on lap eight when Billy Wampler stopped on the speedway.

Using the Delaware restarts, Satterlee chose the outside and maintained the lead when the race resumed.

Miley and Jeff Rine found something on the bottom of the track and moved into the top five. The yellow flag flew again on lap 10 for debris on the speedway.

Yoder drifted high on the restart and Miley, Covert, Rine, and Shaun Jones got by.

Miley turned on the afterburners, went after Satterlee, and blew by him coming off turn four on lap12.

Track points leader Coleby Frye slowed with a blown tire on lap 22 wiping out a sizable points lead going into the night.

Satterlee pressured Miley high and Yoder drove back into third. With five to go Miley was able to gain some breathing room but a third turn spin tightened the field for a green-white-checkered finish.

Miley led the rest of the distance winning over Satterlee, Yoder, Cosner, and Jason Covert.

"I was nervous on that last restart, " Miley said in Victory Lane. "We had four or five of the best

drivers on the east coast here and to beat them is amazing. This is an all new car tonight but we learned a lot from before and put that setup in the car."

Satterlee, Miley, Knaub, and Yoder won the late model heats. Tim Wilson won the consolation.

Devin Adams led the first lap of the 305 sprint car feature but all eyes were on Garrett Bard who rode the rail to second. Dylan Proctor, Zach Newlin, and Jaremi Hanson followed.

Bard, a relative newcomer to sprint car racing, challenged Adams after a few restarts but Adams was able to horsepower away to maintain the lead. Newlin soon challenged and passed Bard for second.

Jake Waters stopped on the front stretch to bring out a lap 13 caution.

Newlin and Hanson started a battle for second with Hanson taking over on lap 15 as Ken Duke moved forward to the fourth spot.

Hanson, using the high groove, put the Ort Racing 36 sprinter beside Adams but could not get past for the lead.

Adams won by .597 seconds over Hanson, Newlin, Duke, and Bard.

"I knew I was going to have to deal with Duke, sooner or later," Adams said of the winner of the last two events at the speedway. "Each time the caution came out there was somebody different in second and I kept looking for him."

305 sprint car heats went to Bard, Adams, and Kenny Heffner.

Brandon Moser grabbed the early lead in the pro stock feature followed by, Kyle Bachman, Corey Long, Shaun Lawton, and Jason Smith followed.

Moser opened a big lead as Bachman and Lawton battled for second.

Moser led the entire distance for his second consecutive win followed by Bachman, Lawton, John Schoch, and Corey Long.

WAGNER WIRES FIELD FOR \$20,000 NACE MEMORIAL NATIONAL OPEN WIN AT SELINSGROVE SPEEDWAY ON RECORD-BREAKING NIGHT

SELINSGROVE, Pa. – Logan Wagner of Harrisonville wired the field for the \$20,000 victory in Saturday night's Jim Nace Memorial/37th Annual National Open for 410 sprint cars presented by Red Robin at Selinsgrove Speedway.

The win was Wagner's first career at Selinsgrove behind the wheel of the Zemco Racing No. 1.

He became the 19th different driver to win the speedway's crown jewel sprint car race. For the past 10 years, the race honored the memory of former five-time sprint car champion Jim Nace of Thompsontown.

Afternoon rain and nighttime humidity produced a smooth, lightning-fast racing surface for the stellar field of drivers all evening.

Kerry Madsen of St. Mary's, New South Wales, Australia, broke the one-lap track for 410 sprint cars in qualifying with a lap time of 15.694, eclipsing the 2011 track record of 15.810 set by Daryn Pittman of Pittsboro, Ind. In all, five drivers broke the former record. Madsen collected the \$300 Fast Tees Fast Time Award.

Garrett Bard of Wells Tannery took the lead on the second lap of the 20-lap 305 sprint car feature and took the win in only his second visit to the track.

Selinsgrove Speedway will close out the 2019 season at 7 p.m. Saturday, Sept. 21, with the Morton Buildings World of Outlaws Late Model Series-sanctioned 21st Annual Late Model Open paying \$10,000 to win. The limited late models will join the super lates on the racing card. Gates will open at 4 p.m.

Front row starters Logan Wagner and Freddie Rahmer led the star-studded field to the green flag with Wagner taking the lead. Brian Brown, Kerry Madsen, and TJ Stutts followed.

Trey Starks slowed on the speedway bringing out the caution on lap eight. Starks was running sixth after starting ninth.

Wagner opened a slight lead on the restart but Rahmer closed in on his tail when the pair hit lapped traffic. Rahmer dogged Wagner until the red flag was shown on lap 20 so the cars could refuel.

As the cars were re-fired, 360 sprint car champion Kyle Reinhardt's car did not fire. Reinhardt was running ninth after starting 21st.

Rahmer looked under Wagner on the restart but it was Wagner who held the lead with the momentum coming off the second turn.

When Wagner hit the lapped cars he had trouble getting around them which put Rahmer back on his nerf bar. Once in clean air he again opened a lead, taking the checkered flag by just .755 seconds in front of Rahmer, Brown, Madsen, and Stutts.

"Tommy (Carl) called me this week and asked how I did at Selinsgrove," Wagner said. "I didn't have the heart to tell him I'd never raced there. This is the biggest win of my career. We timed fast, won the heat, and drew the pole so if anything happened, it was because I screwed up."

"I did race 305's here once and finished second to my brother Mike after we exchanged slide jobs," Wagner added. "He called me and told me to get my butt back there and get the job done."

410 sprint car heats were won by Brown, Wagner, and Rahmer. Lucas Wolfe won the consolation.

Jake Frye jetted to the front of the 305 sprint car lead, followed by Garrett Bard, Keith Prutzman, Jimmy White, and Ian Cumens.

By lap two, Bard, who is a relative newcomer to sprint car racing was in the lead. Bard, racing at the speedway for only the second time, finishing in fifth, took off and hid. His lead at the halfway point was two seconds. The lead was wiped out on lap 18 when Josh Spicer's car erupted in

flames and stopped in the third turn. Spicer was uninjured.

While the cars sat on the speedway, the car of Jeremi Hansen also caught on fire. Those flames were quickly extinguished and Hansen escaped harm. Second running Frye also had issues as his right rear went flat.

Bard led the final two laps winning by 1.039 seconds over Zach Newlin, Prutzman, and Devin Adams. It was Bard's fourth win of the year.

Newlin, Nathan Gramley, and Adams won the 305 sprint car heats. Jake Waters, driving a Jim Nace No. 44 tribute car, won the consolation.

The Morton Buildings World of Outlaws Late Model Series returned to Selinsgrove Speedway Saturday night to wrap up the track's 2019 season in the 21st Annual Jeff's Auto Body National Open.

Former World of Outlaws champion Darrell Lanigan of Union, KY, collected \$10,000 for leading all 40 laps. Known as the "Bluegrass Bandit," Lanigan picked up his 73rd career World of Outlaws win Saturday night at the very same track he won his 72nd feature at – Selinsgrove Speedway— on Sept. 6, 2015, in the Open. He also won the Open in 2013 and 2014.

Rookie Cade Dillard of Robeline, La., was the night's fast qualifier with a lap time of 19.159.

Andrew Yoder of Middleburg won the final event of the season at the track in the 20-lap limited late model feature. The victory was Yoder's second of the year at the track and 11th overall in 2019.

Darrell Lanigan started the 40-lap National Open on the pole and rocketed into the lead over Brandon Sheppard, Ricky Weiss, Dennis Erb and Chase Junghans.

Sheppard pressured early but it was Weiss who challenged him for the runner-up spot.

Brent Larson and Hayes Mattern got together in turn one bringing out the caution on lap three.

Weiss running the bottom got by Shepperd for second and took off after Lanigan.

Lanigan, like Weiss, was looking for his first win of the season and had already built up a 1.5 second advantage.

As the race settled in, eighth starting Greg Satterlee moved into the top five.

Lanigan sliced through lapped traffic but Weiss had trouble moving forward as Sheppard was back on his rear bumper. Once clear of traffic Weiss again pulled away from Sheppard.

Half way through the race, ninth starting Shane Clanton started to show some speed and got by Satterlee for fifth. Two laps later he was fourth.

Boom Briggs rolled to a stop on lap 33 and the caution was displayed once again wiping out a 2.25 second lead for Lanigan.

Lap 37 saw another caution as Mason Ziegler slowed and Coleby Frye, with nowhere to go, slammed the second turn wall.

Lanigan had no trouble holding the lead after the restart and went on to take the checkered flag .656 seconds in front of Weiss, Sheppard, Clanton, and Satterlee.

Jeff Rine in 10th was the highest finishing central Pennsylvania regular.

"We love coming up here and running this place," Lanigan said of his first win in four years, the last coming at Selinsgrove. "It's big and fast and you can run wherever you want. The track crew did a great job. We've been fast lately and I really hate to see the season come to a close."

World of Outlaws heat winners were Weiss, Sheppard, and Lanigan. Frye won the last chance race.

Brad McGinness took a wild flip off of turn two at the start of the limited late model feature. The car cartwheeled down the track with parts flying and a tire rolling down the infield.

Despite the violence of the flip, the safety equipment saved the driver from any injury.

A three-wide race for the lead went to Devin Hart followed by Andrew Yoder, Danny Snyder, Matt Cochran.

Another turn two melee slowed the race on the second lap.

Yoder, running the bottom of the speedway, slid up even with Hart and nosed by him on the fifth lap. Meanwhile Cochran and Shaun Miller moved up to third and fourth.

Kenny Yoder spun in turn two bringing out the yellow flag again on lap seven.

Cochran used the restart to take second as Hart slid high. Two laps later Craig Wagaman, who started 22nd, passed Hart for third.

Yoder ran the rest of the distance unchallenged winning his second race of the season at the track and 11th overall over Cochran, Wagaman, Hart, and Snyder.

Drew Weisser, Yoder, and Hart won the limited late model heats.
